Teacher Guidelines

Plan and teach a Physical Education unit of work showing progression in learning based on a strand or theme for 150 minutes (broken down into lessons of your chosen duration). This time allocation is in keeping with the IPPEA recommendation to NCCA Curriculum Redevelopment Consultation on Time and Structure https://www.ncca.ie/media/3234/written-submissionsdocument_structureandtime_ncca.pdf.

• Children keep a Physical Education Diary to record their learning based on Head, Heart, and Hands (Cognitive/ Knowledge learning, Affective/Emotional learning and Physical learning) (Ní Chróinín, Coulter, & Parker, 2019; Vasily, 2015).

Teacher Guidelines for the Children's Work

How to use the 'Head/ Heart/ Hands' to help the children complete their Physical Education Diary

Diary entries can be completed as an integrative methodology during art lessons, SPHE, or English lessons or whatever lesson is appropriate.

The following narrative may be used to help children understand learning with the head, heart, and hands.

Learning with the head is about learning facts, what you know and remember. For example, did you learn any new rules, facts or strategies today? Writing in your diary you might use the following sentence starters: 'what I know...', 'how I think...' or 'what I remember...'.

Learning with the heart is concerned with how you think and feel about yourself, how you get along with your classmates, and how you communicate. It deals with persistence, grit, and resilience. It also includes to what extent you are helpful to your classmates and how you handle frustration, disappointment, and anger. Writing in your diary you might use sentence starters like 'I learned to work as a team by...' or 'I learned to listen better by...'

Learning with the hands deals mainly with the doing part, the essential skills needed to participate in the activities in Physical Education. When talking about the physical skills you learn in PE don't forget to mention how you use other parts of your body such as your head, eyes and feet. Writing in your diary you might use sentence starters like 'Important physical education skills I learned/ practiced today were'

Teachers' Project Work

As part of the display a cover sheet of on one- or two A 4 sheets must be included. This must:

- Display a clear project title on the display board
- State the learning outcomes for the unit of work including a brief outline of the lesson content on the A 4 sheet(s).

The project will be assessed on the submission on PExpo Day of the cover sheet of one minimum and two maximum A3 sheets displayed on the display boards, along with the wider display and representative samples of children's learning. A selection of the children's diaries must be displayed on the tables with a clear project title visible on the cover of each child's diary. Simple questions about learning in the Physical Education lessons and the diary entry process will be asked to the class teacher and the children by the judges on PExpo day.

Children's drawings, photographs, videos, and written descriptions are acceptable evidence of learning in the diary entries. A selection can also be duplicated to showcase on the display boards. A video on a school laptop/iPad may also be used to showcase children's work at the PExpo day.

Creativity and simplicity in the submission documents are encouraged. A simple record of children's learning is required. We recognise the day-to-day work of the classroom teacher and commitment to all subject areas.

- 3. Pay €20 entry fee as directed PExpo, Trinity Comprehensive School, Ballymun Road, Dublin
- 4. Cheque €20 payable to 'PEXPO'

Include school name and contact details, class teacher name and contact telephone number and finally the project title. Please state how many children and teachers will attend on the PExpo day. All entries must be registered to this email address by 14th February 2020.

(4) Judging Criteria

Project Title and Description

- A project title and description are evident
- Both are displayed on the display boards with samples of children's work

Project learning outcomes and brief lesson descriptions are stated on the A 4 sheets

Project Content

- A clear link between the title, the learning outcomes, and the children's learning
- Information is presented accurately
- The project content is linked to the Irish Primary PE Curriculum
- Work is representative of the children's learning

Coherence/Presentation

- Colourful
- Clear and concise

Verbal Knowledge and Understanding (PExpo Day)

- The teacher and the children will respond to questions about the project and learning
- The children will respond to simple questions about their learning in physical education
- The children will respond to simple questions about their experiences in the Physical Education lessons and in keeping their diaries
